Goal 1

Communicate via clubs and players to identify potential referees and assess their needs.

Goal 2

Provide clear refereeing pathway information via website and direct communication.

Referee Education

Developing more qualified referees in the region and provide training for all players

Goal 1

Provide club-based workshops for all players to learn the basics of refereeing, and give them confidence to referee at club level

Goal 2

Support referees to qualify as District Referees. Strive to achieve a number of qualified referees in each geographical area around the region

Goal 3

Increase numbers of players qualified as Club Referees by making the qualification a requirement for regional interclub and superchamps

Goal 4

Keep an up to date database of active and inactive referees in the community, informing them of upcoming refereeing opportunities and resources.

Support

To provide support, advice and resources that assist National & District Referees to deliver programs that are appropriate and effective to their community needs.

Goal 1

Communicate effectively with the stakeholders, advising and updating them of available programs and courses.

Goal 2

Share resources that will enable District Referees to service their local geographical area

Goal 3

Provide support using all forms of communication, assisting in the development of Club Refereeing Plans.

Goal 4

Mentor new District Referees by linking them with the Refereeing Director or qualified National Referees so they can pass on their experience and guide them

Goal 5

Provide refereeing opportunities, and links to events and workshops.

Retention

To ensure that each qualified referee is valued and recognised by the wider Squash Community.

Goal 1

Provide experiences and opportunities for District & National referees to referee at events, so they can personally develop themselves and enjoy their refereeing experience.

Goal 2

Ensure that referees are recognised for their efforts as measured by nominations in the Squash Bay of Plenty Awards, Bay of Plenty Sports Awards and external Scholarship Applications where appropriate.

Excellence in Refereeing

Ensuring that we have a network of quality referees working together to provide effective and exciting refereeing programs in the Bay of Plenty Region.

Goal 1

Assist District Referees along the pathway to qualify to National level or beyond.

Goal 2

Conduct an annual refereeing conference where referees can share ideas and gain knowledge from refereeing experts.

Goal 3

Expose qualified referees to training opportunities nationally and internationally.

Review and Evaluation

This plan will be reviewed 15th June (half season) in regards to its progress and again the week beginning 31st Oct (full season) as to its effectiveness against the measures that are laid out in the Refereeing Plan. The feedback and learning from the review process will then be utilised when formulating the plans.
