# CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

ASHLEY BROWNRIGG



Another year has gone by and I am happy to present my 12<sup>th</sup> Chairman's Report. Overall it has been a successful year for the board. We have managed to be financially viable and have had a lot of success in the competitive areas of squash.

In the competitive arena the Bay of Plenty Junior Boys Team were again winners of the Inter District Competition. The Bay of Plenty Junior Girls came a very creditable 3<sup>rd</sup> place which meant Bay of Plenty Juniors were the Overall Top District Junior Team in New Zealand. That is an outstanding achievement which reflects on our superior coaching structure.

Both the Bay of Plenty Senior and Masters Teams have competed very well. We have a New Zealand Champion even though both those teams are in the rebuilding phase. More details in the Coach and Masters reports.

At the secondary school level Tauranga Boys College won the New Zealand Secondary Teams title once more.

Of the Bay of Plenty Club Teams that went to the New Zealand Super Champs Finals we had three winners, two runners up and a number of third places. Once again an outstanding result. All these successes are largely as a result of the fact that our district is recognised as having the best coaching structure in New Zealand. Full credit goes to Robbie Wyatt and his assistants especially Graeme Randolph backed strongly in the administrative area by Marcus Niles.

On the financial level Squash Bay of Plenty made a modest profit of \$1,935. We were lucky enough to receive \$56,008 in Gaming Charity Grants which helped tremendously. A word of warning though, we would struggle to operate at the levels we do without these grants so we have to be continually on our guard. Without these grants we would have to increase the Court levies significantly. At present we are confident we will receive similar amounts in the 2015 year.

We are saying farewell to two very valuable Board Members. Firstly Wayne Wills, who is a Life Member, is stepping down. He has been a member of the Board for a long time and has considerable knowledge and wisdom on all matters especially relating to all events. Secondly Gail Bingham, who has done an outstanding job in all the work relating to grant applications, is also stepping down. Both will be sorely missed. My sincere thanks go to both Wayne & Gail for their efforts. We are actively seeking 2 new members, but accept that this will take some time however there is very little activity now until the middle of February 2015.

I would like to say a sincere thanks to both Robbie Wyatt and Marcus Niles who have worked tirelessly for the Board. Both men are highly regarded in New Zealand squash circles and we are very lucky to have them working for Squash Bay of Plenty. I would also like to thank sincerely our other Board Member Vicki Beker for her contribution during the year.

Finally, I would like to wish all squash people in the Bay a very Merry Christmas and look forward to a prosperous year in 2015.

# MANAGER'S REPORT

MARCUS NILES



2014 has been another excellent year for Squash Bay of Plenty. We have undertaken a new branding in line with Squash NZ and the rest of the regions. This will enable us to have a fresh, unified image to move our sport forward.

Clubs are generally reporting solid numbers, and while there hasn't been huge growth, most clubs seem to be ticking along well. The obvious shining light continues to be Devoy Squash & Fitness. This year's BOP Club of the Year is setting the standard for clubs around the country. Not only with its fantastic facility, but with its leadership and structures, not to mention its amazing results on the court across all levels.

The area I am most pleased with this year is the growth in the competitive juniors. The Prince Junior 1 Day Series has been embraced by the clubs and has been extremely successful in giving J grade kids a start in tournaments. It has been well supported with around 150 kids participating. Many of the kids have moved up to E grade and beyond, and will be able to play meaningful senior events next year. Many thanks to the club junior conveners and to Prince who have agreed to continue their partnership into next season.

After consultation with the clubs and players, an interclub structure of two longer modules was settled upon. We ran two 11-week competitions through the middle of the season, with the option for a summer league. There was also a Masters division of 6 teams during the Winter. Summer Interclub didn't attract sufficient entries to go ahead, but Summer Doubles has grown significantly this year. We are running three regional Doubles modules to reduce travel, and numbers have been excellent. This is a real growth area of our sport that I think will continue to engage players during the off-season. The BOP Doubles Championships was brought back this year and I'm sure we will see that flourish in future years.

Communication with clubs continues to be effective with reasonable turn-outs to our sector meetings. Our website and Facebook page are effective tools to communicate with the wider squash community. iSquash is being constantly improved and as more players and clubs use it more effectively, it will become the vital tool Squash New Zealand developed it to be.

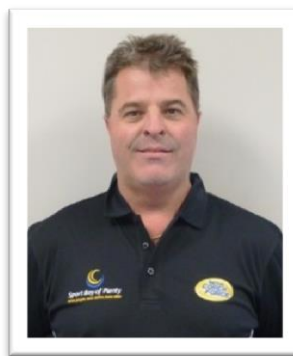

# COACHING DIRECTOR'S REPORT

ROBBIE WYATT



Certainly one of the Bays most successful years with many top results and NZ selections coming our way. Also very rewarding year for school programs, modules being run, and biggest ever entry for AIMS games. Personally the highlight in the playing side of things, was the Bays success at the NZ Junior Individuals and Teams event. BOP had 6 finalists in the age groups, coming away with 2 national titles, 4 runners up and 3 thirds. Jamie Oakley won the boys under 17 title against fellow Tauranga player and mate Alex Revington. Nadia Hubbard comfortably winning the girls under 15 title. Sean Dykes was runner up in the boys under 15. Camden Te Kani-McQueen was runner up in the girls under 17. Manaia Pene was runner up in the girls under 11. 3<sup>rd</sup> placing went to Luke Steyn in the boys under 11s and Luke Cooper finished 3<sup>rd</sup> in the boys under 19s. In the teams event we absolutely cleaned up the boys team title, with 5 of the 6 team members being A grade and the other a top B1. Throughout all our ties we didn't drop a match. The girls also did very well by finishing 3<sup>rd</sup>. Our combined scores meant that for the first time since 1988 BOP won the Gifford Cup putting our district at the top of junior squash for 2014. Read results further on in other reports.

## **BOP Squads**

Another good year with BOP Squads and excellent attendance overall. Last year was the pilot scheme for the Future Stars, and this year it was a big hit with our young up and comers. Huge thanks to all the coaches involved with the Squads: Graeme Randolph, Becky Clarke, Lauren Clarke, Mike Walls, Viv Horne, Darrell Edwards, Wayne Johnston, Mike Dunston and Ashleigh Dunston.

## **Sport Bay of Plenty/Coachforce**

I enjoyed a very good year with Coachforce. School programs in Western Bay are very strong with Graeme Randolph working with Tauranga Intermediate, Pongakawa, Otumoetai Collge. Tauranga Intermediate is a feeder school for Tauranga Boys. Graeme consistently over the last 2 years has 80 to 100 children involved in the squash program at the Intermediate. Tauranga Girls are steadily becoming more involved in squash programs. In 2015 I intend to focus more on school programs in different parts of the region, but of course the biggest challenge is getting a coach/volunteer/parent to help with the development of the program once the school has made contact with me and I visit them and suggest a structure.

## **Junior Convenors**

This year I have found many of the Junior Convenors have been communicating well with me and are wanting junior programs for their coaches to put in place. Knowing our junior programs at grassroots level through to advanced level is tracking well is very rewarding.

## **BOP New Zealand squad members**

For 2014 we had a great number of athletes in NZ Squads. Josh Oakley and Luke Cooper were in the World Boy's Elite Squad. Jamie Oakley, Alex Revington, Tyler Ranger and Levi Casey were all in the National Development Squad. Camden Te Kani-McQueen and Abby Wotten in the girls World Elite Squad. Nadia Hubbard was in the National Development Girls Squad. In the coaching ranks, special mention must go to Dave Clarke who travelled to Scotland as assistant coach for the NZ Team at the Commonwealth Games.

## **Closing**

Over the years I always say that it is a pleasure to work for Squash BOP as Coaching Director and as Baytrust Coachforce Officer. I strongly believe that our district is one of the leaders in New Zealand Squash in several areas, but we should always be looking for ways to continue to improve.

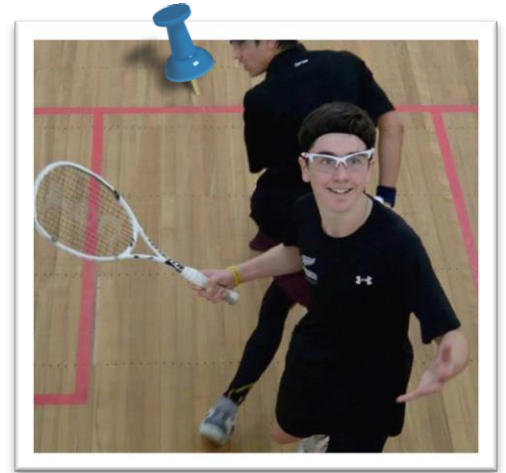

## JUNIOR NATIONALS

Hosted by Remuera Rackets 2-8 October

Very successful National Champs for BOP juniors in 2014. We picked up 2 individual titles and had 6 finalists which is a great achievement. Geyser City's Nadia Hubbard won the girls under 15 title beating Northland's Zoe Dykzeul 15/8 15/9 15/9 in a one-sided match.

Jamie Oakley from Tauranga beat fellow team mate Alex Revington also from Tauranga in a huge battle. 15/13 15/8 5/15 15/13 in the boys under 17s. Sean Dykes had a great tournament to reach the finals in the under 15s but lost to a strong player in Matthew Lucente from Auckland 15/7 15/12 15/9. Rotorua's Camden Te Kani-McQueen reached the girls under 17 final, but was outplayed by Abbie Palmer from Auckland 15/2 15/3 15/5. Manaia Pene from Rotorua lost her final in the girls under 11s in a very close match showing some great fight 15/9 12/15 5/15 15/7 15/9. Other notable results were a very unlucky Glenn Templeton who injured himself in the boys under 13 semi final after comfortably winning the first 2 games. Glenn was the overwhelming favourite to win the title after earlier in the year winning the North Island Champs, easily winning the South Island Champs and also winning the NZ AIMS games title. Luke Steyn from Taupo had a blinder to finish 3<sup>rd</sup> in the boys under 11. Mount's Luke Cooper finished 3<sup>rd</sup> in the boys under 19 after causing an upset in the quarter finals, beating NZ squad member Max Trimble.



### Teams Event:

Great result for the BOP boys team winning the title 4/0 against a gutsy Central districts team. We took a team of 6 away this year with an amazing 5 of the 6 players A grade. Unheard of since the early to mid 80s. The team was Josh Oakley, Joe Lyons, Luke Cooper, Jamie Oakley, Alex Revington and Tyler Ranger. Results: Beat Waikato 4/0. Beat Southland 4/0. Beat Canterbury 4/0. Beat Eastern 4/0. Final beat Central 4/0. We didn't drop a match throughout the teams.

Excellent effort also from a young BOP Girls team beating Canterbury 4/0 for 3<sup>rd</sup> place.

Results: Beat Eastern 4/0. Beat Wellington 4/0. Beat Central 3/1. Lost to Auckland 4/0, but gave them an excellent battle taking games off the Auckland girls who hadn't up until then dropped a single game. Beat Canterbury 4/0.

To top off a great NZ Champs, the BOP boys combined with the girls to win the prestigious Gifford Cup which we hadn't won since 1988. This indicates that in 2014 BOP is the strongest district in the country for juniors. A huge thanks to Cheryl Te Kani-McQueen for coaching the girls. Also a huge thanks to Lynette Revington and Julia Ranger for managing both teams.

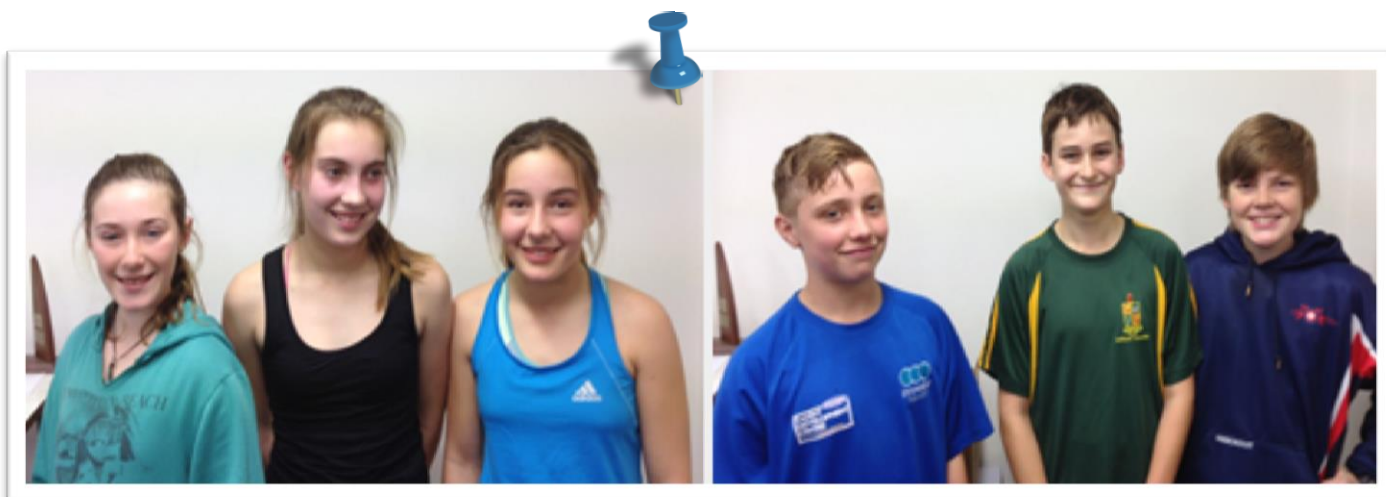

# NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

## FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2014

### 1. Statement of Accounting Policies:

The reporting entity is an Incorporated Society registered under relevant legislation.

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of earnings and financial position on an historical cost basis have been used, with the exception of certain items for which specific accounting policies have been identified.

### 2. Changes in Accounting Policies:

There have been no changes in Accounting Policies. All policies have been applied on bases consistent with those used in previous years.

### 3. Fixed Assets and Depreciation:

All fixed assets are recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Depreciation of the assets has been calculated at the rates determined by the Board

as per the Fixed Asset Schedule.

### 4. Goods and Services Tax:

These financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis with the exception of Accounts Receivable and Accounts Payable.

### 5. Accounts Receivable:

Receivables are stated at their estimated realisable value. Bad debts are written off in the year in which they are identified.

### 6. Income Tax

The society has no Income Tax liabilities whatsoever as it does not pay Income Tax

### 7. Contingent Liabilities

The society has no known Contingent Liabilities or financial commitments except the Loan from Squash New Zealand which has to be repaid within the next year.

### 8. Community Grants
